The 'proposed' Te Waimate Heritage overlay would extend across a large portion of Lot 1 DP 2011442, and poses concerns because this defines active primary production land with a land use capability 2s1, being versatile soils.

The National Policy Statement for Highly Productive Land 2022 came into force on the 17 October 2022, with the goal to secure permanent protection of highly productive soils, land that should remain unencumbered to ensure the élite soils are utilized to their full potential.


To extend the heritage overlay onto this production land presents increased limitations on the lands use, conflicting with the national policy statement, and therefore councils obligations under the RMA 1991 to adhere to those policy provisions.

Without going into explicit detail of each standard applicable; put simply, heritage overlays introduce restrictions on structures and earthworks, both components being part and parcel with maximizing highly productive land.

Attached please find plan of amended Heritage Overlay, which local authority may like to amend further to ensure it accords with the National Policy Statement for Highly Productive Land 2022.
