PLANNER'S REPORT & ASSESSMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL EFFECTS

Thomson Survey Ltd Kerikeri

1.0 INTRODUCTION

1.1 Proposal

RC 2220081-RMASUB was issued on 11th March 2022. Copy attached in Appendix 6. It granted consent for a 5 lot subdivision to be carried out over 3 stages. It included approval from NZTA for crossings.

Since the consent was issued, re-generative plantings undertaken by NZTA as part of the Bulls Gorge realignment works has grown and significantly obstructed the sightline visibility for the entrance into Lot 5. An alternative entrance arrangement has been investigated and discussed with NZTA and they have provided approval, with conditions – which the applicant agrees with.

That is the first reason for this variation – amend entrance arrangements approved by NZTA. The second reason is to alter the stages. Currently, the largest Lot 1 is not created until Stage 3. The consent holder now seeks to have that largest Lot 1 created in Stage 1, along with proposed Lot 2 and a Lot 100 that would then be further subdivided in a Stage 2, creating the remaining Lots 3-5. There will be no longer be a Stage 3.

There are no substantive changes to boundaries or lot areas. However, there are minor changes to both lot and covenant area boundaries. The revised entrance arrangements for the use of CP 8 & 9 will require additional right of way easements as shown on amended plans.

In summary the changes being requested are related to:

- (a) Entrance arrangements; and
- (b) Staging arrangements.

The easiest way to portray the requested stages, given the changes in stages, is by way of a separate Appendix (See Appendix 2). This sets out amended conditions, as requested.

Other changes include additional physical works conditions in regard to formation of shared rights of way; and amended NZTA requirements.

The amended Scheme Plans are attached in Appendix 1. Location map and Record of Title are attached in Appendices 4 & 5 respectively. Communications with NZTA are contained in Appendix 3.

The specific changes being requested are discussed in section 4.0 of this Report.

1.2 Scope of this Report

This assessment and report accompanies the application for a change to conditions (s127) and for an extension to the lapse period (s125). A s127 application is regarded as a **discretionary** activity. The information provided in this assessment and report is considered commensurate with the scale and intensity of the activity for which consent is being sought.

2.0 PROPERTY DETAILS

3.0 SITE DESCRIPTION

The application site consists of a series of grassed ridgelines descending downslope from a bush clad Scenic Reserve, to the State Highway boundary, at Bulls Gorge. The consented subdivision layout effectively provides for house sites on each stable 'spur'. The gullies between the spurs act as overland flow paths, largely intermittently flowing watercourses and swampy areas.

There is minimal indigenous vegetation within the application site, but as stated above, the site bounds Scenic Reserve.

Land in Lot 1 now has an existing formed and approved entrance off State Highway 10.

4.0 CHANGES REQUESTED

The Scheme Plans:

The variation seeks several changes and these are outlined in Appendix 2. The Stage One Variation Scheme Plan creates Lots 1, 2 and 100, where Lot 1 equates to Lot 1 of original Stage 3; Lot 2 equates to the original Lot 2, also created in Stage 3; and Lot 3 equates to the land that will become Lots 3, 4 & 5 in new proposed Stage 2.

Stage 1 condition 2 and Stage 2 condition 5 require amendment accordingly – to refer to new stamped approved plans forming part of this Variation.

The alteration to entranceways results in the creation of rights of way F at Stage 1, and G and H at Stage 2.

The areas identified for bush and/or wetland protection have been amended to more accurately identify those features, and to exclude existing crossings – all of which will still be required for the future lots.

Deletion of Stage 3 in its entirety

The rationale for this is self explanatory. All lots are now to be created in two stages, not three.

Amendment to NZTA Conditions

The emailed preliminary approval from NZTA reads:

For proposed Lots 1-5 – effectively both stages referred to above.

 The vehicle crossing located at NZTM 1686746.81, 6095527.05 (NZTA ref. CP 8) shall be upgraded in accordance with New Zealand Transport Agency Diagram C standard as

- outlined in the Planning Policy Manual (2007) and to the satisfaction of the New Zealand Transport Agency Network Manager.
- 2. The vehicle crossing located at NZTM 1686624.24, 6095701.72 (NZTA ref. **CP 9**) and shall be upgraded in accordance with New Zealand Transport Agency Diagram C standard as outlined in the Planning Policy Manual (2007) and to the satisfaction of the New Zealand Transport Agency Network Manager.
- 3. The vehicle crossings located at NZTM 1686559.60, 6095794.13 (NZTA ref. **CP 10**), NZTM 1686878.58, 6094564.02 (NZTA ref. CP 6) and at NZTM 1686948.35, 6094977.68 shall be permanently closed, including reinstatement of any fence line, grassed areas, berm, highway drainage or kerb. Reinstatement works shall be consistent with the adjacent road reserve treatment, to the satisfaction of the New Zealand Transport Agency Network Manager.
- 4. Prior to the issuing of a certificate pursuant to Section 224(c) of the Resource Management Act 1991, the consent holder shall provide to Council, correspondence from the New Zealand Transport Agency confirming that works in the State Highway, including the upgrading and closure of existing vehicle crossings, have been constructed to the New Zealand Transport Agency standards.
- 5. Prior to the issuing of a certificate pursuant to Section 224(c) of the Resource Management Act 1991, the consent holder shall provide to Council confirmation that the New Zealand Transport Agency has been advised of relevant documentation (such as proposed title references, draft LT (Land Transfer) plan, ML plan (for Maori Land) or SO (Survey Office) plan) to facilitate the registration of any new Crossing Place (CP) Notices against those new titles, under Section 91 of the Government Roading Powers Act 1989.

This is different from the original NZTA approval requirements and reflect the change to no longer utilise CP10 at all. Instead CP9 is to be utilized for one more lot than originally proposed. This will not be required until Stage 2 when the lots using that entrance are created. The upgrade of CP8 will remain a Stage 1 condition, and the newly imposed condition regarding the closure of CP10 will also be a Stage 1 condition.

I believe existing Stage 1 conditions 4(b)-(d) inclusive can be deleted and replaced with Stage 1 Condition 3(b) and Stage 2 Condition 6(a).

New accessway formation on rights of way:

The stage 1 scheme plan shows right of way easement F in favour of Lot 2 over the Lot 1 legin. This is to enable both lots to utilise CP8, to be upgraded, if not already, to Diagram C standard to NZTA's satisfaction. Formation within F must be minimum 3m metal carriageway width with drainage, which it likely is already.

The stage 2 scheme plan shows rights of way G and H over Lot 4 in favour of Lots 3 & 5 (G) and Lot 5 only (H). Again this will require 3m metal carriageway width with drainage, on both G and H.

Areas to be subject to land covenants

These have been amended to more accurately follow the boundaries of the features and to exclude existing crossings which are in existing use and will continue to be required post subdivision. Area U (previously identified as 'S') remains in place for bush protection. The update has resulted in nine areas identified compared to the original eight. Other than updating 'identifiers', the conditions relevant to the covenant areas are not changed.

Consent Notice Conditions

The original consent unnecessarily repeated consent notice conditions in each stage whereas they will have carried down after being applied at Stage 1. For this reason, it is proposed to delete all but one consent notice condition from Stage 2. All those deleted will already have been applied to Lots 1, 2 and 100 created in Stage 1, and will carry down automatically accordingly.

The exception is the one remaining proposed consent notice clause to be imposed as a Stage 2 consent notice condition, in regard to banning cats and dogs. The original consent imposed a ban on Lots 2-5 and this variation will continue to impose it on Lots 2-5 – no change. Lot 2 Stage 1 can have it imposed immediately at Stage 1. However, it does not seem reasonable to impose a ban on Lot 100 Stage 1 given it is nearly 14ha in area and capable of supporting stock. Therefore it is proposed to enable working dogs on both Lots 1 & 100 of Stage 1, just as the original consent provided for Lot 1, Stage 3.

Then as a Stage 2 consent notice clause, the Lot 100 working dog allowance is proposed to be superseded by the total ban to apply to Lots 3-5, as applied in the original consent.

Because the land that will eventually become Lots 3-5 is being created as a single Lot 100 in Stage 1, it is proposed to impose the same consent notice condition as imposed on Lot 1 (Stage 3) of the original consent. This provides for working dogs, which I consider reasonable given Lot 100 is nearly 14ha in area and capable of supporting stock.

5.0 STATUTORY REQUIREMENTS

Applications for changes to consent conditions are lodged pursuant to \$127. Pursuant to clause 127(3)(a), the application for a change to consent conditions is a **discretionary activity** application. Sections 88 to 121 of the Act apply, and the following planners report and Assessment of Environmental Effects is offered pursuant to the requirements of those relevant sections of the Act. The Assessment of Effects only addresses the effects of the change, as specified in \$127.

<u>\$104</u>

\$104 of the Act requires a consent authority to consider any actual and potential effects on the environment resulting from the change; and any relevant provisions of

- (i) A national environmental standard;
- (ii) Other regulations;
- (iii) A national policy statement;
- (iv) A NZ Coastal Policy Statement;
- (v) A regional policy statement;
- (vi) A plan or proposed plan.

<u>Assessment of Environmental Effects</u>

When considering the effects under a \$127 application, it is only the effects of the changes being sought that need be assessed and considered.

The alteration to staging has nil environmental effects as it is simply related to timing.

The amendments to crossing points off State Highway has been assessed by the roading authority and 'approved' subject to conditions. Fewer crossings will result, at the appropriate standard. The changes to the crossings has nil adverse effect, and in fact will have a positive effect.

The creation of rights of way easements F, G & H will require internal access formation and will be to the required standard, thereby having no adverse effects.

Areas shown for bush and wetland protection remain – nil adverse effects. Cats and dogs restrictions amended, but achieving the same thing as in the original consent – nil adverse effect.

Relevant Provisions of planning instruments

No new national or regional planning instruments have been enacted since the original consent was issued.

Part 2 Matters

Similarly, the changes so not require any further consideration under s5-8, Part 2 of the Act.

6.0 CONSULTATION

Under Section 127(4) of the Act:

- (4) For the purposes of determining who is adversely affected by the change or cancellation, the consent authority must consider, in particular, every person who—
- (a) made a submission on the original application; and
- (b) may be affected by the change or cancellation.

The original application was processed on a non-notified basis, under delegated authority. The consent included NZTA consultation and conditions. This variation similarly involves NZTA

and consultation has been carried out accordingly, with approval, subject to conditions, issued.

7.0 CONCLUSION

It is considered the effects of the changes on the wider environment are less than minor. The proposal remains consistent with the relevant objectives and policies of the Operative and Proposed District Plans and the Regional Policy Statement, and Part 2 of the Resource Management Act.

There is no District Plan rule or national environmental standard that requires the proposal to change conditions to be publicly notified and no persons have been identified as adversely affected by the proposal.

It is therefore requested that the Council grant approval to the minor s.127 application on a non notified basis.

1. The subdivision shall be carried out in accordance with the approved plan of subdivision prepared by Donaldsons, referenced Lots 1-5 being a proposed subdivision of Lot 1 DP 545067, dated August 2021, and attached to this consent with the Council's "Approved Stamp" affixed to it.

Explanation: the above condition is unnecessary given conditions 1 and 4 below.

Stage One; Lots 1, 2 and 100 Where Lot 2 will be subject to same/similar conditions as the original consent's Lot 5 also created at Stage 1; and where Lot 100 is of similar size to Lot 1 and should therefore be subject to same/similar conditions as Lot 1 (originally created in Stage 3).

Considered to be the appropriate standard for "F", serving two lots.

Stage Three Lots 1 and 2

Self explanatory – all lots are not being created in two stages. There is no Stage 3.

As a matter of process, when Lot 100 is further subdivided to create Lots 3-5 inclusive, the proposed consent notice clause applying to Lot 100 providing for working dogs will need to be cancelled and replaced with the same consent notice clause as applying to Lot 2 (in order to remain consistent with the intent of the original consent).

Below is possible wording to provide approval for the change to be made.

Proposed 5-Lot Subdivision (Stage 1) - 939 State Highway 10, Kerikeri - Clayton and Kate Straka (Johnsen Farm)

Thank you for your request for written approval from NZ Transport Agency Waka Kotahi (NZTA) under section 95E of the Resource Management Act 1991 (RMA). Your proposal has been considered as follows:

Proposal

Resource consent is sought under s127 of the RMA for the following activities:

- To vary the granted subdivision consent RC 2220081 to vary the granted access arrangements and reduce the subdivision from three stages to two stages.
- Stage 1 will involve the creation of proposed Lots 1, 2 and 100; Stage 2 will involve the creation of Lots 3, 4 and 5 from Lot 100.

<u>Assessment</u>

In assessing the proposed activity, NZTA notes the following:

- NZTA did not provide approval to the subdivision consent RC 2220081 although when contacted by Far North
 District Council at the time of lodgement, did request that Crossing Places, CPs 8, 9 and 10 to upgraded to an
 NZTA PPM Diagram C Standard in August 2021. These were included as conditions of consent by Far North District
 Council
- The subject site has five existing authorised crossing places and following the completion of the subdivision, will
 only have three. The consolidation of the crossing places reduces the proliferation of vehicle accesses along this
 section of the state highway.
- To address the increased traffic generation at CP's 8, 9 and 10, each vehicle crossing will be upgraded to an NZTA
 PPM Diagram C Standard to accommodate the vehicle movements of one residential dwelling per lot.
- Following this subdivision, an additional stage will result in a 2-lot subdivision of proposed Lot 1. Through that subdivision, additional access upgrades will occur to address any potential adverse effects on the operation of State Highway 10.

Limited Access Road (LAR)

Your client's site adjoins State Highway 10 which is identified as a limited access road. Per Section 91 of the Government Roading Powers Act 1989, to access your client's site your client requires a crossing place authorised by NZTA. In this instance there are five authorised crossing places registered on the record of title: CP's 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10. 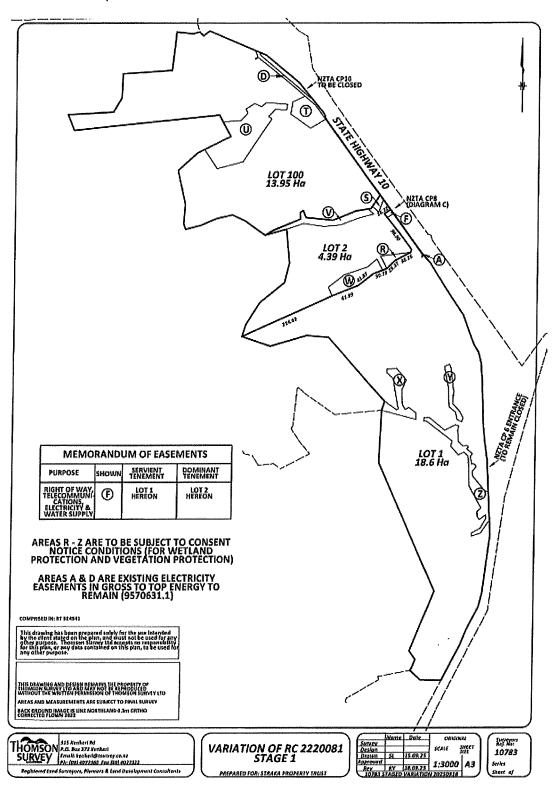

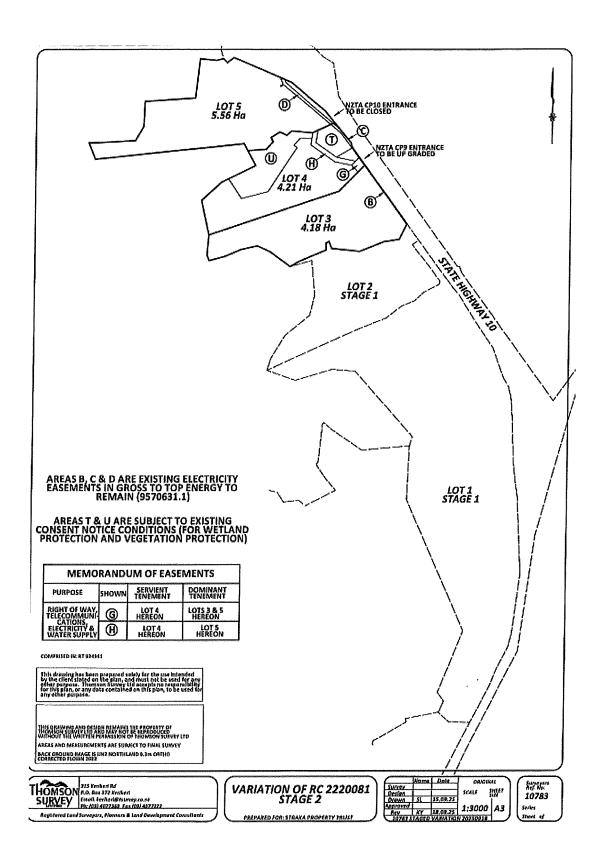

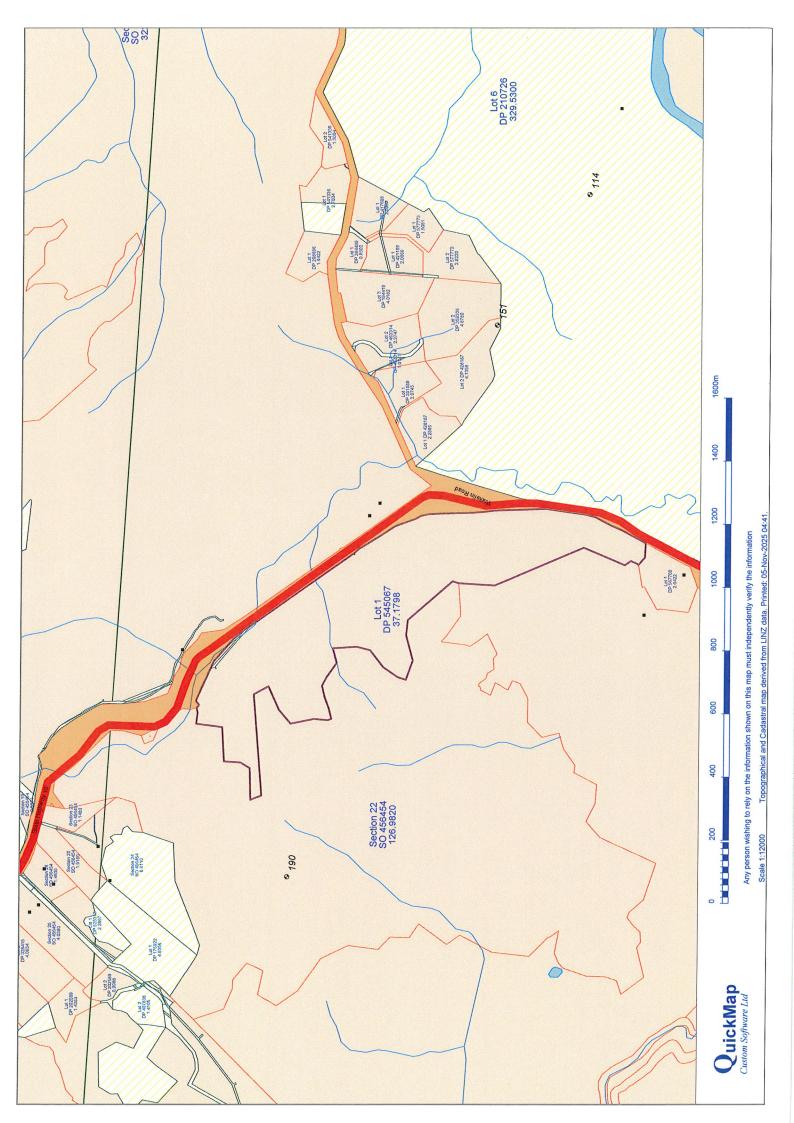
Attachment 1: Proposed Scheme Plan

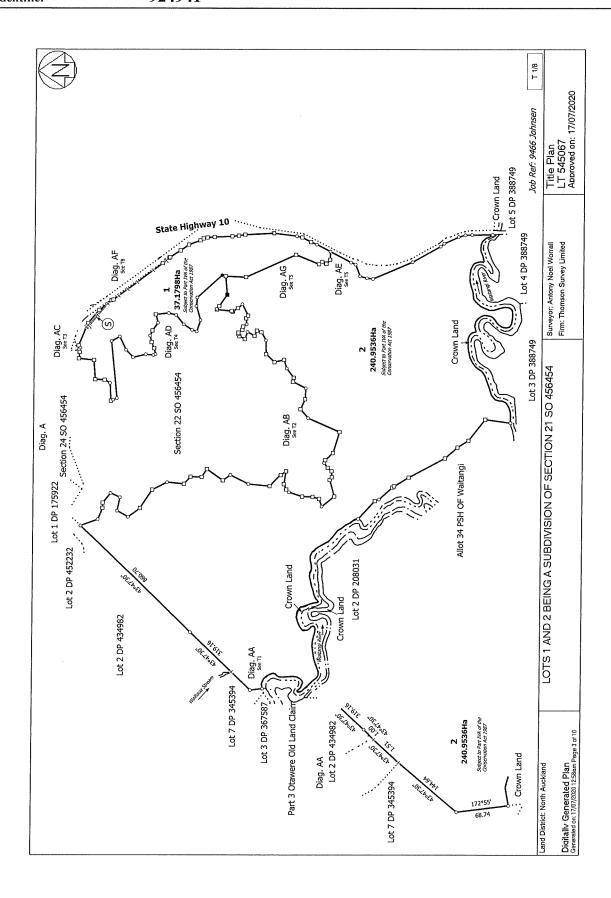

1. Interpretation

- 1.1 In this instrument, unless the context otherwise requires:
 - (a) "Easement Area" means that/those part(s) of the Servient Land marked on Survey Office Plan 456454 with the letter "S".
 - (b) "Servient Land" means the land owned by the Grantor and contained in Computer Freehold Register 627582.
 - (c) "Transmission Line" means wires or conductors of any other kind (including fibre optic or coaxial cables) used or intended to be used for the transmission of electricity and/or telecommunication signals, waves or impulses; and includes any insulators, towers, poles, ground stays, supporting structures, crossarms, foundations, casings, tubes, tunnels, minor fixtures and other items, equipment or material used or intended to be used for supporting, securing, enclosing, surrounding and protecting a Transmission Line; and also includes any buildings, towers or pole mounted transformers, fuses, fuse holders, automatic switches, voltage regulators, capacitors or other instruments, apparatus or devices used in association with a Transmission Line; and anything in replacement or substitution of any of the foregoing;
 - (d) words importing the singular include the plural and vice versa; and
 - (e) references to the Grantor and Grantee include their respective heirs, executors, transferees, administrators, successors and assigns.

2. Grant of electricity easement

- 2.1 The Grantor grants to the Grantee as an easement in gross a right to convey electricity over the easement area with the following rights and powers:
 - to convey, send, transmit and transport electricity and telecommunications signals, waves or impulses, without interruption or impediment and in any quantity by means of the Transmission Line;
 - (b) to survey, investigate, lay, install and construct the Transmission Line on, over or under the Easement Area, at a depth or height and along a line determined by the Grantee;
 - (c) to inspect, operate, use, maintain, repair, renew, upgrade, replace, change the size
 of and remove the Transmission Line;
 - (d) with the Grantee's agents, contractors and employees, and with any vehicles, equipment, tools and materials, to enter and remain for a reasonable time on the Servient Land for any purposes necessary or convenient for the Grantee to exercise its rights under this instrument (including the right to extinguish fires);

- (e) to construct on the Servient Land whatever roads, tracks, access ways, fences, gates and other works are deemed necessary by the Grantee for it to exercise its rights under this instrument and which are approved by the Grantor (that approval not to be unreasonably withheld);
- (f) to keep the Easement Area cleared of all buildings and structures by any means the Grantee considers necessary;
- (g) to keep the Easement Area cleared of all fences, trees and vegetation by any means the Grantee considers necessary where such items:
 - breach any statutory or regulatory requirements or standards or codes of practice or otherwise breach generally accepted engineering standards as to the minimum clearance of the Transmission Line;

- (h) by whatever means the Grantee considers necessary, to level and grade any stockpiled soil, sand, gravel or other substance or any materials, walls or other earthworks that may exist on the Easement Area in order to ensure that the clearance above the ground level of the Transmission Line is maintained greater than any minimum clearance height that may exist from time to time in statute, regulations, code of practice or otherwise.
- 2.2 The Grantee has no obligation to construct the Transmission Line or convey electricity through it continuously or at all.

3. Ownership of the Transmission Line

The Transmission Line will at all times remain the property of the Grantee.

4 Restrictions on Grantee's use

- 4.1 The Grantee must, in exercising its rights under this instrument, cause as little disturbance as is reasonably possible to the Grantor, the Servient Land and the Grantor's stock and other property and must ensure that, where applicable, all gates on the Servient Land are left as the Grantee finds them.
- 4.2 The Grantee must restore any part of the surface of the Servient Land, that is affected by the Grantee exercising any of its rights under this instrument to a condition equivalent, as far as reasonably practicable, to that existing before the Grantee exercised those rights.

5 Grantor's Continued Use of Servient Land

Subject to clause 6, the Grantor may use the Servient Land as long as that use does not unreasonably interfere with the enjoyment of the Grantee's rights and interests granted under this instrument.

6 Restrictions on Grantor's use

- 6.1 The Grantor must not do or allow any act which may interfere with or affect the rights of the Grantee or the operation of the Transmission Line and, in particular, the Grantor must not, without the consent in writing of the Grantee:
 - (a) On the Easement Area, or within the minimum distance from the Transmission Line as advised by the Grantee (having regard to relevant statutory or regulatory requirements, codes of practice and engineering standards applicable from time to time), erect or permit the erection of any buildings or structures, or alter or allow to be altered the overall dimensions of existing buildings or structures, or carry out any earthworks or stockpiling, or construct or permit the construction of any roads, dams, walls or driveways, or allow any vegetation to become established, or remove or permit the removal of any soil, sand, gravel or other substance;
 - (b) disturb the soil of the easement area below the depth of 0.3 metres within a distance of 6 metres from the visible outer edge of any tower, pole, ground stay, support or foundation comprising part of the Transmission Line;
 - (c) cause or knowingly permit flooding of the Easement Area;
 - (d) burn off crops, trees or undergrowth on the Servient Land;
 - (e) operate or permit to be operated any machinery or equipment (including any cranes, drilling-rigs, pile-drivers and excavators) in close proximity to any tower, pole, ground stay or support comprising part of the Transmission Line;
 - (f) disturb any survey pegs or markers placed on the Easement Area by the Grantee;
 - (g) impede the Grantee's access over the Servient Land or the Easement Area or to the Transmission Line; or
 - (h) do anything on or in the Servient Land which would or could damage or endanger the Transmission Line.
- 6.2 The consent of the Grantee required under clause 6.1 will not be unreasonably withheld, but may be given subject to conditions.
- 6.3 The Grantee may consent in writing to certain existing buildings, structures, fences or vegetation on the Easement Area at the date of this instrument remaining there, but such consent may be given subject to conditions.
- 6.4 If any act or item consented to under clause 6.2 or 6.3 subsequently results in a situation described in clause 2.1 (g)(i) (iii), then such consent may be revoked by the Grantee without compensation.
- 6.5 Before exercising any right under this instrument to remove a fence, the Grantee must consult with the Grantor so the Grantor is given a reasonable opportunity to co-ordinate the erection of any necessary replacement fence. The cost of any replacement fence will be borne by the Grantor and the Grantor must comply with any reasonable directions of the Grantee as to the height, materials used and location of such replacement fence.

8 Licence and assignment

9 Perpetual easement

There is no power implied in this instrument for the Grantor to terminate the easement for any breach of this instrument or for any other reason. It is the intention of the parties that the easement created by this instrument will continue forever unless surrendered.

10 Arbitration

If any dispute arises between the parties in relation to this instrument or any matter arising under it and that dispute cannot be resolved by negotiation, then the parties must submit the dispute to arbitration in accordance with the Arbitration Act 1996 (and its amendments or any statute which replaces it). The arbitration will be commenced by either party giving written notice to the other of the details of the dispute and that party's desire to have the matter referred to arbitration. The arbitration will be by one arbitrator, if the parties can agree upon one, and, if not, then by two arbitrators, one to be appointed by each party, and their umpire to be appointed by the arbitrators before they begin to consider the dispute. The award in the arbitration will be final and binding on the parties.

 - ii. In conjunction with the construction of any building requiring a wastewater disposal system the lot owner shall obtain a Building Consent and install the wastewater treatment and effluent disposal system. Any proposed wastewater treatment and effluent disposal system shall be designed and constructed, noting the restrictions and limitations included int the On-Site Wastewater Assessment for a Proposed Subdivision prepared by Haigh Workman with reference 21 144, dated August 2021 included in RC2220081.

The installation shall include an agreement with the system supplier or its authorised agent for the ongoing operation and maintenance of the wastewater treatment plant and the effluent disposal system.

Following 12 months of operation of the wastewater treatment and effluent disposal system the lot owner shall provide certification to Council that the system is operating in accordance with its design criteria. [All Lots]

- iii. In conjunction with the construction of any dwelling, buildings, facilities or impermeable surfaces, the consent holder shall provide and implement a stormwater management plan for the site. The management plan shall be prepared and certified by a suitably qualified chartered professional engineer and submitted for approval by Council at building consent stage. Stormwater management must be based on Low Impact Design Principles to achieve outcomes set out in Section 4.3.7 of the New Zealand Standard for Land Development and Subdivision Infrastructure (NZS4404:2010). [All Lots]
- iv. No occupier of, or visitor to the site, shall keep or introduce to the site carnivorous or omnivorous animals (such as cats, dogs or mustelids). [Lot 2]
- v. Management of activities on Lot 2, with respect to the natural wetland areas indicated by drawing as per per Condition (2)(a) of Stage 1, is to be undertaken so that the natural range of water levels and the natural ecosystem of plants and animals they support do not change as a result of such activities, except by way of a consent from the Council.[Lot 2]
- vi. Reticulated power supply or telecommunication services are not a requirement of this subdivision consent. The responsibility for providing both power supply and telecommunication services will remain the responsibility of the property owner. [All Lots]
- vii. In conjunction with the construction of any dwelling, and in addition to a potable water supply, a water collection system with sufficient supply for firefighting purposes is to be provided by way of tank or other approved means and to be positioned so that it is safely accessible for this purpose. These provisions will be in accordance with the New Zealand Fire Fighting Water Supply Code of Practice SNZ PAS 4509. [All Lots]
- viii. No occupier of, or visitor to the site, shall keep or introduce to the site carnivorous or omnivorous animals (such as cats, dogs or mustelids).

Two working farm dogs as defined in the Dog Control Act 1996 is exempt from this condition if they are:

- (a) micro-chipped,
- (b) within a dog proof fence area, on a lead or under effective control at all times when outside the fenced area,
- (c) kept in a kennel or tied up at night.
- (d) For any dog written confirmation that the dog has current kiwi aversion training certification along with the expiry date for the certification.

Prior to the keeping of introduction of any working dog to the site the occupier must provide the following to the Councils Resource Consent Monitoring Officer:

- (a) A photograph of the dog;
- (b) Written confirmation that the dog has been micro-chipped;
- (c) A plan showing the extent of the dog proof fenced area.

It is considered the relevant and potential effects have been addressed within the assessment of effects above, and it has been concluded that the adverse effects will be less than minor.

Positive effects of the proposal:

Under s104(1)(a) the positive and potential effects of the proposal are:

- a) Formal protection of existing wetlands on the subject site.
- b) Cats and dogs restrictions

Objectives and policies of the District Plan:

The following objectives and policies of the District Plan have been considered:

- a) Chapter 8, Section 6 Rural Production Zone
- b) Chapter 13 Subdivision

The proposal is not contrary to the relevant objectives and policies of the District Plan. The proposal is considered to be generally consistent with the relevant objectives and policies. With a minimum lot size of four hectares, it is considered that the proposed allotments are of sufficient size to accommodate residential activity whilst maintaining sufficient pastoral land for productive use. The sites are surrounded by a mixture of lifestyle and large farm allotments. The subdivision will not restrict neighbouring rural production activities to occur, and still allows for farming activities.
