Report to the Hearings Panel – Late Submissions

Introduction

This report is prepared to provide to the Hearings Panel Chair a schedule of late submissions, the dates on which they were received, a brief summary of the relief sought and a recommendation, with reasons, as to whether or not the Hearing Panel Chair should accept each of the late submissions. This report considers late submissions that were received by the Far North District Council ("Council") to the Far North Proposed District Plan ("the Plan"). The Plan was publicly notified on Wednesday the 27 of July 2022. The process was open for 60 working days and the closing date for lodging submissions was Friday the 21 of October 2022. There were 580 submissions received on the Plan.

The submissions were publicly notified for further submission on Monday the 7 of August 2023. The process was open for 20 working days and closed on Monday the 4 of September 2023.

This report has been prepared under section 42A of the Resource Management Act 1991 ("RMA"), to assist the Hearings Panel to decide whether it should waive the failure to comply with the time limits as provided for under sections 37 and 37A of the RMA. This report includes recommendations from the planner who prepared this report and identifies the late submissions that are recommended to be accepted. The recommendations contained in this report are not decisions of the Hearings Panel Chair. Where the Hearings Panel Chair decides to waive the failure of submissions to comply with the time limit and accept the submissions, the content of those submissions (in particular, the decisions requested) will be considered in subsequent Section 42A hearing reports.

1. Statutory Framework

This section of the report sets out the statutory framework within which the council must consider whether to allow late submissions. The starting point is Clause 1 of Schedule 1 of the RMA which states that where any time limit is set in this Schedule, a local authority may extend it under Section 37 of the RMA. Sections 37 and 37A deal with the power and requirements of a waiver and extension of time limits. Section 37(1)(a) states:

A consent authority or local authority may, in any particular case, -

- a) extend a time period specified in this Act or in regulations, whether or not the time period has expired; or
- *b)* waive a failure to comply with a requirement under this Act, regulations, or a plan for the time or method of service of documents.

Section 37A then sets out the requirements for waivers and extensions as follows:

- (1) A consent authority or local authority must not extend a time limit or waive compliance with a time limit, a method of service, or the service of a document in accordance with section 37 unless it has taken into account –
 - (a) the interests of any person who, in its opinion, may be directly affected by the extension or waiver; and
 - (b) the interests of the community in achieving adequate assessment of the effects of a proposal, policy statement, or plan; and
 - (c) its duty under section 21 to avoid unreasonable delay.



- (2) A time period may be extended under section 37 for
 - (a) a time not exceeding twice the maximum time period specified in this Act; or
 - (b) a time exceeding twice the maximum time period specified in this Act if the applicant or requiring authority requests or agrees...
- (6) A consent authority or a local authority must ensure that every person who, in its opinion, is directly affected by the extension of a time limit or the waiver of compliance with a time limit, a method of service, or the service of a document is notified of the extension or waiver.

It is noted that there is no maximum time period specified in the RMA for submissions and therefore section 37A(2) does not apply. Rather, the Act specifies that the closing date for submissions on a proposed plan shall be at least 40 working days after public notification (refer Clause 5(3) of Schedule 1 of the RMA).

Consideration of late submissions

Twenty-seven **original submissions** were received after Friday the 21 of October 2022. These are categorised as follows:

Category A- This category contains original submissions received within 1 week of the closing date of Friday the 21 of October 2022, but before the Summary of Decisions Requested (SDR) was released on the 7 of August 2023. These were included in the SDR. There are **9** submissions in this category.

Category B – This category contains original submissions received more than 1 week past the closing date, but before the SDR was released on the 7 of August 2023. These were included in the SDR. There are **13** submissions in this category.

Category C – This category contains original submissions received more than 1 week past closing date, but before the SDR was released on the 7 of August 2023, however they were missed / omitted from the SDR. There are **2** submissions in this category.

Category D – This category contains very late original submissions which were received after the SDR was released on the 7 of August 2023 and were not included in original SDR. There are **3** submissions in this category.

Sixteen **further submissions** were received after Monday the 4 of September 2023. These are categorised as follows:

Category E - This category contains late further submissions received within 1 week of the closing date of Monday the 4 of September 2023. There are **8** further submissions in this category.

Category F - This category contains late further submissions received later than 1 week after the closing date of Monday the 4 of September 2023. There are 8 further submissions in this category.

The Hearings Panel Chair has requested Council compile a schedule of these late submissions, the dates on which they were received, a brief summary of the relief sought and a recommendation as



to whether or not the Hearing Panel should accept each of the late submissions. The details of each of the late submissions in accordance with the Hearings Panel directions are outlined in the table below.

The nature and content of the late submissions vary; many are site specific and relate to one particular property, while others address District-wide matters.

4 Recommendations and Reasons

Council has only recently appointed the Chair and started to form the hearing panel. This has resulted in an unusual period of time to still make a late submission, especially in relation to original submissions. This has created a somewhat unusual situation, and mixed messaging hence the recommendation to accepted late original submissions made prior to the notification of the SDR.

Additionally, these submissions raise matters that are within scope of the Plan. It is considered that there is no prejudice to any person directly affected by the Hearings Panel Chair accepting these late submissions. It is appropriate that those matters be tested through the Schedule 1 process along with all other matters raised in these submissions. The remaining three extremely late original submissions were received in August and December 2023, after the Summary of Decisions requested was notified and call for further submissions completed. It is recommended that, these extremely late submissions are rejected due to extreme lateness.

Accordingly, taking into account the matters set out in Section 37A(1) of the RMA, it is recommended that the Hearings Panel accept twenty-four of the original submissions (Category A, B and C), and accept all sixteen of the further submissions (Category E and F) so that the issues raised can be considered in the hearings.
